An Awe-Inspiring Commitment to Service Dear Parishioners,

If you are receiving this message midweek via email or on the parish website, I'd like to call your attention to a host of beautiful feast days leading up to Sunday. On Wednesday Sept 29, we celebrate the feast of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Thursday is the feast of St Jerome, Biblical scholar and Doctor of the Church. Friday is the feast of the Little Flower, St Therese of Lisieux, and Saturday is the feast of Holy Guardian Angels. Early next week, Monday October 4, we have the feast of St Francis of Assisi on the calendar and on Tuesday, the feast of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos. The work and example of these holy beings make for very inspiring reading for the whole family. It would be worth your while to look them up.

A few weeks ago, we talked briefly about Redemptorist Blessed Francis Seelos in connection with the start of the school year and his dedication as a teacher to his seminarians and other young ones. What we didn't talk about was just how whole-hearted he was in his attitude to serving the sick and the poor in New Orleans when he was sent to America for mission work. It was a time of frequent yellow fever epidemics in those areas. He eventually contracted yellow fever while ministering to the sick. He was so well-liked by then that the newspapers would give regular reports on the status of his health. When he eventually succumbed, huge crowds gathered to mourn the loss of this beloved man.

Bearing in mind the limitations of the pandemic, we can still do a lot to develop an awe-inspiring commitment to service. We currently have sign-ups for the Meal Prep Program for Inner Hope Ministries. There will be other opportunities within and beyond our parish to participate. I encourage older teens and parents to look out for these and consider sharing your time and talents in this way.

Please note, this weekend is Safe Haven Sunday. The Archdiocese of Vancouver has dedicated these days to promoting the need to protect our children from the ill-effects of pornography. For resources, please go to family.rcav.org/safehaven

Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos Feast Day: October 5

Zeal as a preacher and a confessor led Father Seelos to works of compassion as well. Born in southern Bavaria, he studied philosophy and theology in Munich. On hearing about the work of the Redemptorists among German-speaking Catholics in the United States, he came to this country in 1843.

Ordained at the end of 1844, he was assigned for six years to St. Philomena's Parish in Pittsburgh as an assistant to Saint John Neumann. The next three years Father Seelos was superior in the same community, and began his service as novice master. Several years in parish ministry in Maryland followed, along with responsibility for training Redemptorist students. During the Civil War Fr. Seelos went to Washington, D.C., and appealed to President Lincoln that those students not be drafted for military service, although eventually some were.

For several years, he preached in English and in German throughout the Midwest and in the Mid-Atlantic states. Assigned to St. Mary of the Assumption Church community in New Orleans, Fr. Seelos served his Redemptorist confreres and parishioners with great zeal. In 1867, he died of yellow fever, having contracted that disease while visiting the sick. He was beatified in 2000.
