2024: A Year to Rediscover Prayer

Last Sunday during the Angelus, Pope Francis officially declared 2024 will be the Year of Prayer Pope Francis wrote: "In this time of preparation, (for the 2025 Jubilee Year) I would greatly desire that we devote 2024, to a great "symphony" of prayer.


Prayer, above all else, to renew our desire to be in the presence of the Lord, to listen to him and to adore him. Prayer, moreover, to thank God for the many gifts of his love for us and to praise his work in creation, which summons everyone to respect it and to take concrete and responsible steps to protect it. Prayer as the expression of a single "heart and soul" (cf. Acts 4:32), which then translates into solidarity and the sharing of our daily bread. Prayer that makes it possible for every man and woman in this world to turn to the one God and to reveal to him what lies hidden in the depths of their heart. Prayer as the royal road to holiness, which enables us to be contemplative even in the midst of activity. In a word, may it be an intense year of prayer in which hearts are opened to receive the outpouring of God's grace and to make the "Our Father," the prayer Jesus taught us, the life programme of each of his disciples».

In order for the Jubilee to be an event that spiritually enriches the life of the Church and of the entire people of God, becoming a concrete sign of hope, it has to be prepared for and lived in individual communities with that spirit of expectation which is typical of Christian hope. The Year of Prayer fully corresponds to this need.

This is not a Year marked with particular initiatives; rather, it's a privileged time in which to rediscover the value of prayer, the need for daily prayer in the Christian life; a time to discover how to pray, and above all how to educate the people of today in prayer, in this age of digital culture, so that prayer can be effective and fruitful. We cannot deny the fact that our time manifests a profound need for spirituality. The louder the cry of technology that seems to correspond to all our desires, the deeper we discern the search for a true spirituality that brings each person back to encounter themselves in the truth of their existence and therefore in a coherent relationship with God.

There are many people who pray every day; perhaps, I dare say, everyone prays. No statistic can give us a true picture, with figures and percentages, of this very intimate experience of people who know the multi-faceted nature of prayer in a completely personal way. From those who quickly make the sign of the cross, to those who participate in the daily Eucharist, there is such a vast range of ways of praying that no one can fully describe them all. From quick to distracted prayer; from contemplative prayer to prayer filled with tears of pain ... prayer cannot be captured in a pre-established pattern because it is a manifestation of the believer's personal relationship with God himself within that intimate and exclusive relationship that distinguishes our faith. The Year of Prayer, therefore, fits into this context as a way of fostering the relationship with the Lord, offering moments of genuine spiritual rest. It is like an oasis sheltered from daily stress where prayer becomes nourishment for the Christian life of faith, hope and charity.

For this reason, the Dicastery has prepared a series of materials and aids for the coming months and which can constitute a 'symphony' of prayer forms that the Christian community and individual believers can use.

THE SUNDAY OFFERING Some Thoughts on Being A Good Catholic Steward

Each of us builds up the Church by returning a portion of God's gifts of time and talent through parish and diocesan ministries and programs - especially by participating in ongoing faith formation initiatives - and by returning the gift of financial resources through the weekly offertory, special collections, and random acts of generosity.

Intentional stewards plan their giving in advance according to what they have earned through the grace of God. Simply put, Christian stewards give as an expression of their gratitude to God for the gifts He entrusted to them.

You know you have become a sacrificial giver when the offering that you place before the altar fully expresses your gratitude. It isn't about giving until it hurts, but rather giving until it feels good. Perhaps your long-term desire is to return something like 10% back to God through the parish offertory. If you find yourself at 2% now, a sudden increase to may not be practical.

Consider taking a step to become a 5% steward: for households earning \$34,000 annually, your weekly offering would be \$34. With annual income of \$57,000. your weekly offering would be \$57. And, for those with annual earnings of \$72,000, your weekly offering would be \$72. Trust God, and take that step. (Each of the above examples is technically 5.2%, but neither God nor your parish will mind.)

But the fruits of our stewardship need not end when eternal life begins. A permanent endowment, designated to fund one or more of your treasured Catholic ministries will exist in perpetuity (forever) so your assets yield a significant return over time while continuing to build God's Kingdom.

Accompany Our RCIA Newcomers Into the Faith Life

As our catechumens prepare for Easter, we are looking for supporters to help accompany them in this exciting phase of their lives. Here is a guideline.



The Ministry of the Sponsor

- To be a sponsor is to accompany, not be a teacher, spiritual director or an expert in the Catholic faith.
- A sponsor is a living example of what it means to be an ordinary, happy Catholic.
- A sponsor supports the candidate through the gift of her or his presence, consistently and intentionally.
- A sponsor is a witness of the candidate's spiritual journey into the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor helps the candidate discover the Church as a living, practical, day to day reality.
- A sponsor presents the needs of his or her candidate to God daily in prayer.

Basic Requirements of a Sponsor

To be a sponsor, you must...

- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Have received the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and
- Be someone other than the parent of the catechumen/candidate.
- Be a practicing Catholic in good standing with the Church.
- (Preferably) be a registered member of the parish.
- (Preferably) be someone other than the spouse or significant other of the catechumen/candidate.
