


SUNDAY COFFEE VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

Upcoming -Save the dates

In September of 2025 we hope to offer both Alpha and the RCIA process. Our plan is to offer the Alpha course on Tuesday mornings 9:00 am -10:30 am in the Parish Hall. With a strong desire to engage School parents; our reasoning for this change in time is as follows: Monday morning at 9:00 am there is a school assembly, Wednesday is already a shortened day with early dismissal, Thursday morning the Parish offers a coffee club and Friday mornings there is a School mass at 9:00 am. Concisely – we will offer tea, coffee, fruit, muffins and the like, watch a video, and have small group discussion.

RCIA and Sacramental Preparation will run concurrently on Tuesday night. RCIA will not be offered on Sunday morning- all candidates for RCIA will be asked to attend on Tuesday evening and attend mass on Sunday.

We decided to not run the Rite of Christian Initiation for the year 2024-2025. Our goal was to ask potential candidates to complete the Alpha program with us and then if they so desired to continue their initiation into the Catholic Church.

Alpha is open to all people, non baptised, every denomination etc. –it provides a safe comfortable place to share with others, questions, and thoughts that we all have in our search to love Jesus more. It is a terrific opportunity especially for school parents to learn more about Jesus and to share the experience with their children.


